Aspects of Advent: Joyful hope

In a couple of weeks' time, when we celebrate Christmas, we may well hear the carol *Joy to the World*. It's the coming of Christ which brings us joy. The angel who appeared to the shepherds says as



much: "I bring you news of great joy: today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you." But even now, as we await this feast, the Church invites us to rejoice. Today's readings make it clear (see below). This Sunday is called *Gaudete Sunday*, a Latin word meaning, precisely, "rejoice!" Our joy comes not from a reality already witnessed by our eyes or experienced in every aspect of our lives, but from the sure and certain hope that Christ will fulfil all His promises. He has already overcome all that causes suffering, even death itself. We await the Second Coming, in which Jesus will finally make clear His victory and free us from everything that causes us distress. This is our faith; this is the hope it brings. In Advent we recognise this, and rejoice in the hope Jesus alone can bring.

Today's Readings

This year we will mostly hear from St Mark's Gospel at Sunday Mass, but Mark's is the shortest account of the Lord's life and work; so short, in fact, that there's not enough to fill every Sunday of the year. So on some Sundays, such as today, we dip into St John's Gospel. We are introduced to John the Baptist, a "witness to the Light", who speaks humbly of his own ministry and foretells One who is greater than he. Again, our hearts are being prepared for meeting the Lord anew. The first reading is once again taken from the writings of Isaiah, who speaks of a Messiah who has received the Spirit of the Lord (a text that Jesus later applied to Himself – see Luke 4:18-26); a gift that brings joy and exultation. St Paul also tells us to rejoice: "Be happy at all times... give thanks" and encourages us to live holy and blameless lives, sustained by the grace of God, as we await the Second Coming.
