October: Month of the Holy Rosary

This Thursday is the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary; in fact the whole month of October is one of special devotion to this beautiful prayer. In the Rosary we not only 'say' prayers; we also meditate on the mysteries of the life of Jesus, seen through the eyes of Mary. The Rosary invites us to join with her in pondering the mysteries of the life of Jesus, and treasuring them in our hearts (Luke 2:51). In this way, Mary accompanies us as we grow in knowledge and love of her Son. If you don't already pray the Rosary regularly, why not



give it a try this month? You could even just pray one decade per day – it takes only 2-3 minutes – and so spend a little part of your day in the company of Jesus and Mary. If you need a list of the mysteries, do a quick online search or pick up any good general Catholic prayer book, where the mysteries will be listed. We pray the Rosary in church on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays straight after 9:15am Mass, and on Fridays at 11:40am, before the lunchtime Mass begins.

Today's Readings

The Bible begins with an account of the creation of the world, and then — in Genesis 2 — explores more deeply the creation of human beings. Today's first reading comes from this chapter, and is concerned to show that, as human beings, we are made for communion with one another: "It is not good that the man should be alone." In human terms, this communion is most fully expressed in the faithful love of husband and wife, as Genesis states and as the Lord reiterates in the Gospel. In the second reading, we begin hearing from the letter to the Hebrews, an anonymous text filled with dense teaching about Christ's role as the High Priest of the New Covenant between God and His people.
