

SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 23rd February 2020

People of the Word: Joseph

Last week we heard of the twelve sons of Jacob, the origins of the twelve tribes of Israel. Today we look more closely at Joseph, one of Jacob's sons whose famous story marks an important turning point in the history of God's people.



Joseph was the first son of Jacob's beloved wife, Rachel. He was a favourite of his father, who had a fine coat made for him (the 'technicolour dreamcoat' of the

musical!) But his brothers were jealous and sold him to slave traders, who took him to Egypt, where he worked before being wrongly imprisoned. Gifted by God with an ability to interpret dreams, he helped Pharoah, who then honoured Joseph with high office in his kingdom.

Later, when famine struck their land, Joseph's brothers came to Egypt to seek help, and came before Joseph. When they discover that he's still alive, they bring their father, who believed that Joseph was



dead, for an emotional reunion. After Jacob's death, the brothers settled in Egypt – initially as free men. But later, their descendants – the people of the twelve tribes – would become slaves. Joseph's story is told in Genesis chapters 37-50.

Questions for reflection:

- Joseph's brothers sold him because they were jealous. Are there people I am jealous of? Am I content with what God gives me?
- When Joseph was sold to slave traders, it looked like disaster, but it led him
 to greatness in Egypt. Can I see times in my life when God has led me
 through a time of hardship to give me a better future?
