# NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
