Baptism: living a life of faith together

Baptism makes us members of the Church, drawing us into relationship with God (whom from then on we can call our Father) and one another. Being a member of the Church gives us responsibility for one another, to help each other in our faith and in practical need. How often are we conscious of our baptismal vocation – our call to follow Jesus? How can we remind ourselves of this calling?

Focus on... Miles for Syria

Join us on our virtual journey to Aleppo! The aim is to complete the virtual 2,650 miles journey from St Clare's to Aleppo, by walking, cycling, running (or some other method) and pledging to contribute £1 per mile.

So, if you pledge to walk 20 miles then your financial pledge is £20. You can also raise more money by



obtaining sponsorship for your pledged distance. You can submit as many envelopes as you want (just drop envelopes into the collection baskets) – if you pledge 50 miles/£50 you could submit this over 5 weeks in 5 envelopes.

You are also very welcome to donate money without pledging miles! Just use the brown envelopes in the narthex. By doing this you are still supporting our journey to raise £2,650, which will go to support displaced families in Syria.

As we receive pledges we will plot our way across the map to Aleppo. Your pledge can be made by using the Pledge Envelopes (available in the narthex), or donating through our 'Just Giving' page: www.justgiving.com/fundraising/milesforsyria
