Franciscan of the Week: St Clare of Assisi

Clare was born into a noble family on 16th July 1193, in the family home, a stone's throw from the town's cathedral. As a child she demonstrated great holiness and a love for the poor, sometimes sending them gifts of food and other necessities. In her late teens she heard Francis, another native of Assisi, preaching in the town. Clare was enthralled by Francis' preaching, and she met with him regularly, in secret, for around a year or so, before deciding to follow him.

On Palm Sunday 1212, Clare left the family's mansion under cover of darkness and made her way down the valley to the chapel of St Mary of the Angels (the 'Portiuncula'), where she was met by Francis and his brothers. Here she made her vows and exchanged her fine clothes for a rough habit: Clare had entered religious life.



Not long afterwards, Clare and the sisters who joined her settled at San Damiano, a church outside the city walls, where they lived a life of poverty, prayer and humble service to one another. Clare was known for her outstanding holiness, her humility, her wisdom and her mircales. She wrote a rule of life for the sisters to follow – the first rule written by a woman in Church history – and this was approved by the Pope just two days before she died. She went to the Lord on 11th August 1253, and was canonised just two years later. The order she founded, the Poor Clares, are still active around the world. Today we ask her to pray for our parish as we joyfully celebrate her feast.
