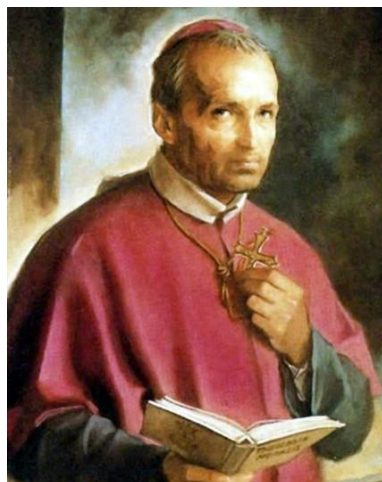


"Intended to become true images of His Son..."

God wants us to be images of His Son – Christ-like in our thoughts, words and actions. So St Paul teaches in today's second reading. On Tuesday this week, we celebrate the feast of a saint who has a lot to teach us about this: St Alphonsus.

Focus on... St Alphonsus Liguori

It's fair to say that St Alphonsus is not the most famous of saints, and not the sort of saint to attract devotion from lots of people, like St Anthony or St Francis do. But we all have reason to be grateful to him, and most of us will be familiar with some of his work. He wrote probably the best-known reflections on the Stations of the Cross, including the famous prayer, "I love You, Jesus, my love above all things..."; he is also the author of some well-loved hymns, including 'O Bread of Heaven' and 'O Mother blest'.



Alphonsus was born near Naples in 1696 and spent his whole life in Italy: first as a lawyer, then a priest. He founded the Redemptorist Order, who are still very active today, and was made a bishop. He died in 1787. His greatest contribution to the Church is his moral theology: he understood and taught that the Church's moral teaching is not just a set of rules, but an aid to help us become like Christ. This is our goal – to become Christ-like. Alphonsus is honoured as a Doctor of the Church – one of those saints whose message is considered universally important and relevant.
