"The Spirit comes to help us in our weakness..."

St Paul writes these words specifically in relation to prayer. "When we do not know how to pray as we ought," he says, "the Spirit Himself expresses our plea in a way that could never be put into words." Sometimes during our prayer we feel we don't know what to say, or how to use the time. Let's remember what St Paul teaches: the Holy Spirit is on our side. Even if we are struggling to pray, as long as we make the time to try, we can be sure that the Holy Spirit is bringing our prayer to the Father.

Focus on... the importance of rest

Our schools finished for summer this week, and for many people that means summer holidays are not too far away. A lot of people will no doubt be looking forward to some relaxation, and this is a good thing: God commands it! In the Bible, we read that God commands rest on the



sabbath day: this is a day to be devoted to Him, to our families, and to recovery from the work we must do. Jesus noticed how hard the disciples worked for Him, and told them: "You must come away and rest for a while" (Mark 6:31). Sometimes He says the same to us. It can be very hard in life to find some time to rest and recover, but it is important to try – God wants us to be well and to enjoy life! Let's remember, though, that the sabbath is a day not only of rest but of prayer: we never take a break from our prayers, since God is the One who gives life and restores us. As Jesus told us recently, "Come to me, all you who labour and are overburdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).
