Easter is the greatest celebration of the year. Jesus rises from the dead, beginning a new creation in which everything will finally be as God intended: free from sin, suffering or death. Today's feast – the start of a 50-day season – is a celebration of our sure and certain hope of eternal life. A very happy Easter to you all!

Focus on... The Emmaus Walk at St Clare's

What did the Lord and His disciples talk about on the road to Emmaus? They walked for several miles with Him, and their hearts 'burned within them' on the road, that first Easter Sunday evening. What inspired them?

The Gospel tells us that as they walked, Jesus explained all the passages throughout Scripture (in this case, the Old Testament) that were about Himself. Their hearts burned within them because they began to see Jesus, their friend, in the Old Testament, and in doing so discovered that, despite His



death, He really is the One sent by God as our Saviour and Lord. During Eastertide, each Sunday afternoon at 4pm, we will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament with a reflection on the Emmaus walk, each week looking at different places where we find Jesus present in the Old Testament. Hopefully we too will come to see that He fulfils all God's promises, and is our Saviour. Then there will be a period of silent prayer before we celebrate Vespers (evening prayer) at 4:30pm, ending with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament just before 5pm. Why not come and make the Emmaus walk with Jesus this Eastertide?

"At Easter, on the morning of the first day of the week, God said once again: "Let there be light". The night on the Mount of Olives, the solar eclipse of Jesus' passion and death, the night of the grave had all passed. Now it is the first day once again – creation is beginning anew. "Let there be light", says God, "and there was light": Jesus rises from the grave. Life is stronger than death. Good is stronger than evil. Love is stronger than hate. Truth is stronger than lies. The darkness of the previous days is driven away the moment Jesus rises from the grave and Himself becomes God's pure light. But this applies not only to Him, not only to the darkness of those days. With the resurrection of Jesus, light itself is created anew. He draws all of us after Him into the new light of the resurrection and He conquers all darkness. He is God's new day, new for all of us."
