Our first 50 years: 1973

The first entry in the school log book for 1973 notes that building work has begun on the second phase of the school, only around 14 months after its opening. There were 109 children on roll, up from 36. In February there was a meeting to discuss provision of school places for Fulwood children, as there was overcrowding at Our Lady and St Edward's school – a sign of the rapidly growing community in Fulwood. The building work wasn't entirely smooth: there were concerns about security and the headteacher had to request that the builders put a fence around the excavations and the building work (after the work had started!), to stop children getting too close. The log book records that the school was always closed on Holy Days of Obligation, presumably so that children could mark the days and attend Mass with their families. That said, on the feast of Sts Peter and Paul, 29th June 1973, the infants had a school trip to Blackpool Tower Circus.

Today's Readings

On this, the last Sunday of the Church's year, the readings move away from the sequential reading of St Mark's Gospel and the letter to the Hebrews, and focus completely on the theme of Christ the King. In the Gospel, we find Jesus on trial before Pontius Pilate, in an exchange which discusses the nature of His kingdom. Here we see Jesus apparently weak: a captive, on trial before a provincial governor; and yet He is the Lord of all. We get glimpses of His real power and glory in the other readings. The prophet Danial sees "one like a son of man" (a title Jesus frequently uses to refer to Himself) coming into the presence of "the One of great age" (God the Father) and receiving a sovereignty that will never end. In the second reading we hear from the last book of the Bible, the Apocalypse (or Revelation). Here too we see Jesus "coming on the clouds", as in Daniel's vision and in last week's Gospel. But He also shares His kingship with His faithful, making us "a line of kings, priests to serve His God and Father."
