Franciscan of the Week: St Elizabeth of Hungary

Today we come to our final Franciscan of the Week: St Elizabeth of Hungary. As a princess, she's hardly a typical Franciscan, but she is the patron of the Third Order. As a child she was betrothed to Ludwig, a German prince, and they entered an arranged marriage. Despite the circumstances, they fell in love and were blessed with three children. But Ludwig's family disapproved of Elizabeth, accusing her of being too simple and too charitable. When Franciscan missionaries arrived in Germany Elizabeth was won over by the stories of Francis and Clare, and —



although she didn't enter religious life – lived in the Franciscan spirit, showing incredible generosity to the poor. When Ludwig died, his family disowned Elizabeth and she lived in relative poverty for the rest of her life, but remained generous to others. She died, aged just 24, in 1231 – only five years after St Francis' death – and was canonised less than four years later.
